

### Important Information

### For your safety

To prevent severe injury and loss of life/ property, read this section carefully before using the product to ensure proper and safe operation of your product.

#### WARNING

#### Power connection

- Use only the power source marked on the product.
- Do not overload power outlets and extension cords. This can result in the risk of fire or electric shock
- Completely insert the AC adaptor/power plug into the power outlet. Failure to do so may cause electric shock and/or excessive heat resulting in a fire.
- · Regularly remove any dust, etc. from the AC adaptor/power plug by pulling it from the power outlet, then wiping with a dry cloth. Accumulated dust may cause an insulation defect from moisture, etc. resulting in a fire.
- Unplug the product from power outlets if it emits smoke, an abnormal smell, or makes an unusual noise. These conditions can cause fire or electric shock. Confirm that smoke has stopped emitting and contact an authorised service centre.
- Unplug from power outlets and never touch the inside of the product if its casing has been broken open.
- Never touch the plug with wet hands. Danger of electric shock exists.

### Installation

- To prevent the risk of fire or electrical shock. do not expose the product to rain or any type of moisture.
- Do not place or use this product near automatically controlled devices such as automatic doors and fire alarms. Radio waves emitted from this product may cause such devices to malfunction resulting in an accident.

#### Operating safeguards

- Do not spill liquids (detergents, cleansers, etc.) onto the telephone line cord plug, or allow it to become wet at all. This may cause a fire. If the telephone line cord plug becomes wet, immediately pull it from the telephone wall jack, and do not use.

- We recommend using the batteries noted on page 4. USE ONLY rechargeable Ni-MH batteries AAA (R03) size.
- Do not mix old and new batteries.
- Do not open or mutilate the batteries. Released electrolyte from the batteries is corrosive and may cause burns or injury to the eyes or skin. The electrolyte is toxic and may be harmful if swallowed.
- Exercise care when handling the batteries.
   Do not allow conductive materials such as rings, bracelets, or keys to touch the batteries, otherwise a short circuit may cause the batteries and/or the conductive material to overheat and cause burns.
- Charge the batteries provided with or identified for use with this product only, in accordance with the instructions and limitations specified in this manual.
- Only use a compatible base unit (or charger) to charge the batteries. Do not tamper with the base unit (or charger).
   Failure to follow these instructions may cause the batteries to swell or explode.

### For best performance

#### Base unit location/avoiding noise

The base unit and other compatible Panasonic units use radio waves to communicate with each other.

- For maximum coverage and noise-free communications, place your base unit:
  - at a convenient, high, and central location with no obstructions between the handset and base unit in an indoor environment.
  - away from electronic appliances such as TVs, radios, personal computers, wireless devices, or other phones.
  - facing away from radio frequency transmitters, such as external antennas of mobile phone cell stations. (Avoid putting the base unit on a bay window or near a window.)
- Coverage and voice quality depends on the local environmental conditions.
- If the reception for a base unit location is not satisfactory, move the base unit to another location for better reception.

### Environment

- Keep the product away from electrical noise generating devices, such as fluorescent lamps and motors.
- The product should be kept free from excessive smoke, dust, high temperature, and vibration.
- The product should not be exposed to direct sunlight
- Do not place heavy objects on top of the product
- When you leave the product unused for a long period of time, unplug the product from the power outlet.







- USE ONLY Ni-MH batteries AAA (R03) size.
- Do NOT use Alkaline/Manganese/Ni-Cd batteries.



### **Battery charge**

Charge for about 7 hours.

• When the batteries are fully charged, the charge indicator goes off.





















## Note when setting up

#### Note for connections

- The AC adaptor must remain connected at all times. (It is normal for the adaptor to feel warm during use.)
- The AC adaptor should be connected to a vertically oriented or floormounted AC outlet. Do not connect the AC adaptor to a ceiling-mounted AC outlet, as the weight of the adaptor may cause it to become disconnected.

### During a power failure

The unit will not work during a power failure. We recommend connecting a corded-type telephone (without AC adaptor) to the same telephone line or to the same telephone line jack using a T-adaptor.

### Note for battery installation

- Use the supplied rechargeable batteries. For replacement, we recommend using the Panasonic rechargeable batteries noted on page 4. 6.
- Wipe the battery ends (⊕, ⊕) with a dry cloth.
- Avoid touching the battery ends (⊕,
  ⊕) or the unit contacts.

### Note for battery charge

- It is normal for the handset to feel warm during charging.
- Clean the charge contacts of the handset and base unit with a soft and dry cloth once a month. Clean more often if the unit is exposed to grease, dust, or high humidity.

### Note:

- It is normal for batteries not to reach full capacity at the initial charge.
   Maximum battery performance is reached after a few complete cycles of charge/discharge (use).
- Actual battery performance depends on a combination of how often the handset is in use and how often it is not in use (standby).
- Even after the handset is fully charged, the handset can be left on the base unit without any ill effect on the batteries.
- The battery level may not be displayed correctly after you replace the batteries. In this case, place the handset on the base unit and let it charge for at least 7 hours.





















### A Soft keys

The handset features 2 soft keys and a joystick. By pressing a soft key, or by pressing the centre of the joystick, you can select the feature shown directly above it on the display.


### B Joystick

By pushing the joystick ( $[ \land ], [ \lor ], [ \lor ],$ or [►]) repeatedly, you can:

- scroll through (up, down, left, or right) various lists or items
- adjust the receiver or speaker volume (up or down) while talking
- As all multiple items cannot be displayed on screen at the same time, you can quickly search the desired item to move screens by pushing the joystick right or left, instead of scrolling down or up line by line (page 26).



# Temporarily switching the display mode

You can select to display either a single item or multiple items on one screen at a time for the following features:

- menu list, phonebook list, caller list, redial list, and recorded message list
- handset top menu icons in function menu

You can temporarily switch the display mode as follows by pressing **E** shown when viewing the lists or selecting menu icons with:

- multiple entries/all menu icons are shown on one screen at a time
- an entry/a menu icon is shown on one screen in large characters at a time

- You can set the unit to always show either single or multiple items beforehand by selecting "Single Item" or "Multi Items" as the display mode setting (page 25).



### Screen saver mode

The backlight goes dark when on a call or turns off completely after 1 minute of inactivity if the handset is not on the base unit.

Activate the handset display again by:

- pushing the joystick left [◄] or right (►) when on a call.
- pressing (\*\*\*\*O) at all other times.



## Adjusting the receiver or speaker volume

### Editing/erasing/storing

## Pause (for PBX/long distance service users)

A pause is sometimes required when making calls using a PBX or long distance service. When storing a calling card access number and/or PIN in the phonebook, a pause is also needed (page 20).



















### Making/Answering Calls

**Example:** If you need to dial the line access number "0" when making outside calls with a PBX:

- 1  $[0] \rightarrow \mathbb{P}$
- 2 Dial the phone number.  $\rightarrow$  [ $\rightarrow$ ]

#### Note:

 A 3 second pause is inserted each time p is pressed. Repeat as needed to create longer pauses.

### **Answering calls**

When a call is being received, the ringer indicator on the handset flashes.

- 1 Lift the handset and press [ → ] or [ ← ] when the unit rings.
  - You can also answer the call by pressing any dial key from [0] to [9], [\*], or [#]. (Any key answer feature)
- When you finish talking, press [★①] or place the handset on the base unit.

### Auto talk

You can answer calls simply by lifting the handset off the base unit. You do not need to press [ ]. To turn this feature on, see page 22.

### Adjusting the handset ringer volume Push the joystick up or down repeatedly to select the desired volume while the handset is ringing for an incoming call. Note:

 You can also program the handset ringer volume beforehand (page 21).

# Useful features during a call

### Mute

While mute is turned on, you can hear the other party, but the other party cannot hear you.

- 1 Press during conversation.
  - 🔯 flashes.
- 2 To return to the conversation, press again.

### Recall/flash

[R/②] allows you to use the special features of your host PBX such as transferring an extension call, or accessing optional telephone services.

#### Note:

 To change the recall/flash time, see page 22.

## For call waiting or Call Waiting Caller ID service users

To use call waiting, you must first subscribe to the call waiting service of your service provider/telephone company.

This feature allows you to receive calls while you are already talking on the phone. If you receive a call while on the phone, you will hear a call waiting tone. If you subscribe to both Caller ID and Call Waiting with Caller ID services, the 2nd caller's information is displayed after you hear the call waiting tone on the handset

- 1 Press [R/O] to answer the 2nd call.
- 2 To switch between calls, press [R/⊕].



























### Making/Answering Calls

#### Note:

 Please contact your service provider/ telephone company for details and availability of this service in your area.

## Temporary tone dialling (for rotary/pulse service users)

You can temporarily switch the dialling mode to tone when you need to access touch-tone services (for example, telephone banking services).

- 1 Make a call.
- 2 Press [\*] when prompted to enter your code or PIN, then press the appropriate dial keys.

#### Note:

 The dialling mode will return to pulse when you hang up.

### Handset voice enhancer

This feature clarifies the voice of the person you are talking to, producing a more natural-sounding voice that is easier to hear and understand.

- 1 Press I during a call.
- 2 [▼]/[▲]: "Voice Enhancer" → OK
- 3 [▼]/[▲]: Select "Off", "High Tone", Or "Low Tone". → OK

### Note:

- When this feature is turned on, 
   (" is displayed.
- Depending on the condition and quality of your telephone line, this feature may emphasise existing line noise. If it becomes difficult to hear, turn this feature off.
- This feature is not available while using the speakerphone.

## Recording a telephone conversation (KX-TG8421)

### Important:

- Before recording a conversation, you should inform the other party that the conversation is to be recorded.
- 1 Press III during an outside call.
- 2 [▼]/[▲]: "Record Call" → OK
  - A beep is heard and recording starts.
  - A beep sounds every 15 seconds and can be heard by the other party.
- **3** To stop recording, press .

#### Note

• To listen to the recorded conversation, see page 33, 34.

### **Key lock**

The handset can be locked so that no calls or settings can be made. Incoming calls can be answered, but all other functions are disabled while key lock is

To turn key lock on, press (centre of joystick) for about 3 seconds.

- 🕟 is displayed.
- To turn key lock off, press (centre of joystick) for about 3 seconds.

### Note

 Calls to emergency numbers cannot be made until key lock is turned off.



















#### **Phonebook**

### Handset phonebook

The phonebook allows you to make calls without having to dial manually. You can add 200 names and phone numbers, assign each phonebook entry to the desired category.

### **Adding entries**

- 1  $\bigcirc$  (left soft key)  $\rightarrow$   $\bigcirc$
- 2 [V]/[A]: "New Entry"  $\rightarrow$  OK
- 3 Enter the party's name (16 characters max.). → **OK** 
  - You can change the character entry mode by pressing 1/A/2 (page 41).
- **4** Enter the party's phone number (24 digits max.). → **OK**
- 5 [▼]/[▲]: Select the desired category.→ OK 2 times
  - To add other entries, repeat from step 3

### Categories

Categories can help you find entries in the phonebook quickly and easily. When adding an entry to the phonebook, you can assign it to the desired category. 





## **Using Caller ID service**

### Important:

 This unit is Caller ID compatible. To use Caller ID features, you must subscribe to a Caller ID service. Contact your service provider/ telephone company for details.

### **Caller ID features**

When an outside call is being received, the caller's phone number is displayed. Caller information for the last 50 callers is logged in the caller list from the most recent call to the oldest.

- If the unit cannot receive caller information, the following is displayed:
  - "Out of Area": The caller dials from an area which does not provide a Caller ID service.
- "Private Caller": The caller requests not to send caller information.
- If the unit is connected to a PBX system, caller information may not be properly received. Contact your PBX supplier.

### Missed calls

If a call is not answered, the unit treats it as a missed call and 3 is displayed. This lets you know if you should view the caller list to see who called while you were away. Even if only one missed call in the caller list is viewed (page 31), 3 disappears from the display. When you receive another new call, 3 is displayed again.

### Phonebook name display

When caller information is received and it matches a phone number stored in the phonebook, the stored name in the

phonebook is displayed and logged in the caller list.

## Category settings for phonebook

Category settings can help you identify who is calling by using different ringer tones and display colours for different categories of callers. When adding an entry to the phonebook, you can assign it to the desired category (page 18). When a call is received from a caller assigned to a category, the category's display colour and ringer tone you selected are used.

### Changing category ringer tones

If you select "Default Ringer", the unit uses the ringer tone you set on (page 21) when calls from this category are received. The default setting is "Default Ringer".






















# Voice mail service

Voice mail is an automatic answering service offered by your service provider/ telephone company. After you subscribe to this service, your service provider/ telephone company's voice mail system answers calls for you when you are unavailable to answer the phone or when your line is busy. Messages are recorded by your service provider/ telephone company, not your telephone. When you have new messages, ⋈ is displayed on the handset if message indication service is available. Please contact your service provider/telephone company for details of this service.

#### Important:

- If ⋈ still remains on the display even after you have listened to new messages, turn it off by pressing and holding [#] for 2 seconds.
- To use the voice mail service provided by your service provider/telephone company rather than the unit's answering system, turn off the answering system (page 32). For details, see page 37. (KX-TG8421)




























# **Character entry**

The dial keys are used to enter characters and numbers. Each dial key has multiple characters assigned to it. The characters that can be entered depend on the character entry mode (page 41).

- Use the joystick to move the cursor.
- Press dial keys to enter characters and numbers.
- Press C to erase the character or number highlighted by the cursor. Press and hold **C** to erase all characters or numbers.
- Press [★] to switch between uppercase and lowercase.
